

Menstrual Equity for All

One in five US girls have missed school time because they do not have access to period products. A survey of low-income women in a large U.S. city found that nearly 2/3 of them could not afford menstrual products the previous year. No one should have to forego education or employment opportunities because they do not have access to menstrual products nor be forced to choose between purchasing food or paying rent and buying menstrual products.

The Menstrual Equity for All Act is a whole-of-government approach to eradicate period poverty and achieve menstrual equity. As your constituent and an advocate for gender equality, I join the Zonta USA Caucus, a group of nearly 8,500 US members of Zonta International in urging you to co-sponsor and support H.R. 364.
