I have some wonderful news for District 10. At the end of February our District Treasurer, Marianne Seal, reports that our membership number stands at 635! This tops our May 2015 number of 625. Lisa Carren-Graubard has been recognized by Zonta International with a long-term member award for her 25 years in service through the Zonta Club of Dallas.



In January, Kath Mazzella from Australia was visiting in our area. Kath was awarded the Zonta Woman of Achievement Award there in 2005 and has worked alongside Zonta in Australia for many years helping to raise awareness of gynecological health issues.



Kath has declared Gynecological Health Awareness Day September 10th, and has created "Undies for Understanding," an international campaign related to Gynecological/Sexual/related

Mental Health issues that she says has taken her 20 years to come to fruition. We created "undies" out of paper and ribbon and the young girls at the Transitional Living Center created the same as well as decorated cookies with undies after listening to a presentation on gynecological health.

Kaleta Doolin just received her full diamond pin! This is for her accumulated donations to the ZI Foundation. She gave \$100,000 this year to the endowment fund. The minimum cumulative amount for 15 "diamond" stones is \$120,000.





The Dallas Club also recently hosted their Annual Amelia Earhart Luncheon where they invite girls from the community to come learn to be empowered. Lt. Governor Barbara Yoder was in attendance. 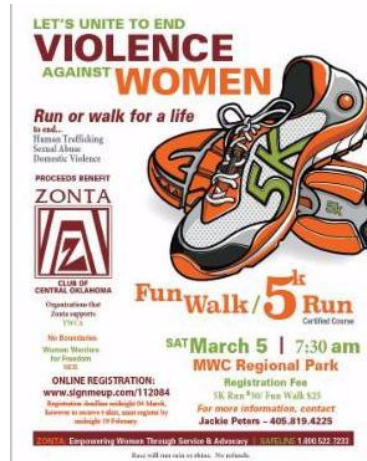
Parker County

Zonta Club of Shreveport: Congratulations on 75 Years!!! January brought excitement to the Zonta Club of Shreveport as they celebrated and remembered beloved member Amelia Earhart.

Love was evident during the month of February as the club volunteered at Dress for Success to help women bloom as they prepared to re-enter the job market. Zonta Club of Shreveport partners with this international organization to help promote the economic independence of disadvantaged women by providing professional attire, a networking of support and the career development tools to help women thrive in work and in life. Club members sparkled in their "Orange" attire on February 25th to bring awareness to poverty and violence against women.

March brought an array of activities as they celebrated "Women's History Month"/ International Women Day March 8th. On Zonta Rose Day the club visited the American Rose Garden to honor past leaders. The Club has its own yellow Rose planted in the Garden. Members are encouraged to donate to the Rose Fund in memory of a deserving woman to celebrate her legacy. Later in March members will join the Bossier Commission on Women in a luncheon to recognize and honor First Responders who have devoted their lives to keeping our communities safe.

April will be filled with festivities as the Club celebrates seventy-five years of empowering women. Chartered in April 1941, daily tributes during the month will be posted on the media sight to highlight members and leaders that have made outstanding contributions over the years. Additionally, memorable events will be spotlighted.

Zonta Club of Longview: Recently the Zonta Club of Longview was able to provide \$3400 to the Longview Police Department for sending two officers to specialized training regarding sex trafficking. They hosted focus groups with our Longview Police Department and CPS workers and are planning to do training with 50+ officers and 15 CPS in April. A Walk for Awareness was held in conjunction with the East Texas Anti-Trafficking Team's Walk A Mile in Her Shoes with 100+ people in attendance. Also held was their Zonta Prom Boutique which provides 250+ young women a formal dress, shoes and accessories and a chance to win a \$1000 scholarship.

The club held specialized training for their volunteers working with the young women about sex trafficking and offered a showing of "Chosen" to the young women and parents which teaches about the warning signs for sex trafficking. They also award a \$500 scholarship for YWPA to a lovely young lady that attended their last program meeting. At that meeting, they hosted a round table discussion with local women elected officials from City Council and School Board.



Zonta Club of Houston: The Zonta of Houston had a successful 4rd Annual Charity Clay Sport Shooting Event which was held on Saturday, February 20th at the American Shooting Center. New at this event was the successful "silent auction". The event supports the Zonta Club of Houston Educational & Charitable Fund (ZCHECF). They are also very busy each month working with Ten Thousand Villages. The ongoing service projects also include: Cloth, Houston Rescue and Restore Coalition, Bay Area Turning Point and The Women's Home.

Zonta Club of Lafayette: The Zonta Club of Lafayette has been busy planning for the 7th Annual Save Ze Ta Taz and is looking forward to a very successful event. The event was held March 10th.

The club recently sponsored the Faith House (A domestic Violence Crisis Center) King Cake 5K Run and the Family Justice Center (A Community Alliance for Justice and Hope). They also made a donation to and Acadiana Symphony's Do Re Me project. They were excited to award the UL Mary Dichmann scholarship and are looking forwarding to awarding the YWPA scholarship at the Save Ze TaTaz event. The club continues to support S.A.N.E. Zonta Club of Greater East Texas: The Zonta Club of Greater East Texas has been very busy! Their Antique Show was a huge success and made a profit of \$26,000. The service chair will be meeting to help them decide where to give the money! Very exciting and Congratulations!!!

Advocacy - Sheryl Flanigan

March is certainly an important month for those who advocate for women's rights.

On March 1, 1978, Women's History Week was first observed in Sonoma County, California.

On March 1, 1987, Congress passed a resolution designating March as Women's History Month.

On March 4, 1917, Jeannette Rankin took her seat as the first female member of Congress.

On March 8, International Women's Day, whose origins trace back to protests in the U.S. and Europe to honor and fight for the political rights for working women, is recognized, as is our own Zonta Rose Day.

On March 11, 1993, Janet Reno is confirmed as the first woman U.S. Attorney General.

On March 12, 1912 - Juliette Gordon Low assembled 18 girls together in Savannah, Georgia, for the first-ever Girl Scout meeting.

On March 31, 1888, the National Council of Women of the U.S. is organized by Susan B. Anthony, Clara Barton, Julia Ward Howe, and Sojourner Truth, among others, the oldest non-sectarian women's organization in the U.S.

On March 31, 1776, Abigail Adams writes to her husband John who is helping to frame the Declaration of Independence and cautions, "Remember the ladies..."

To learn more about the often overlooked history of women in our country, I encourage you to visit the web site of the National Women's History Project at www.nwhp.org. So little is widely known about the sacrifices made by our fore-mothers to ensure that the next generations enjoyed opportunities and rights that they didn't. Every month should be a time to remember these sacrifices, but we can surely especially do so during the month of March.

In the United States, Equal Pay Day is observed on the 12th of April, the date women must work into the new calendar year to earn what men earned the previous year. In other countries, Equal Pay Day is observed later in the year to signify at which point women are no longer paid for their work, compared to men. This information has been passed on to the club's advocacy chair earlier this week.

Area meetings are approaching. A time when we can reconnect and renew our Zonta spirit. The biennium is also coming to a close. As of February 29, District 10 is ranked second in overall in giving with \$187,313.71. That is really incredible. Do you realize we are only \$12,686.29 away from raising \$200,000!



Zonta International also recently released an announcement regarding the Individual and Club Foundation Reception to be held in Nice, France this summer.

For Individual Recognition:

- Donors who reached \$1000 of total contributions during the biennium
- Donors who gave \$1000 or more during the biennium
- Donors who have reached a lifetime giving of \$25,000 or above

For Club Recognition:

- Clubs that gave \$20,000 or above during biennium
- The 50 clubs with the highest average individual contribution per member will receive two tickets to the reception.

For District Recognition:

- The three districts with the highest total donations during the current biennium
- The district with the highest weighted increase during the current biennium
- District that have 100% of the clubs contributing during the current biennium.

The deadline for recognition in Nice is April 30, 2016. To be included in the annual report for foundation giving, donations must be made by May 30, 2016. As you might notice, Zonta International has removed recognition for 100% individual giving. District 10 is very proud to have clubs achieve 100% individual giving to the foundation, therefore I will be recognizing this achievement at the District conference this fall. As of this writing, Zonta International is still discussing whether or not to include recognition in the annual report for 100% individual club giving.

I am so proud of each and every one of your clubs for your generosity and I look forward to seeing you all next month!

Amelia Earhart - Carole Moffatt

Our District 10 Clubs have been busy celebrating Amelia Earhart in the past few months!

The Zonta Club of Central Oklahoma was honored to have Lt. Col. Trisha Luiken as their guest speaker in January. Lt. Col. Luiken serves as Inspector General for the 72 ABW at Tinker Air Force Base. She is also an aviator and a Mission Crew Commander for E-3 air-craft. Lt. Col. Luiken has worked in 14 different states, had 19 assignments in 20 years and lived and worked in 20

countries. She spoke about the mission of the E-3 AWACS aircraft. The E-3 flies at an altitude of 29,000-31,000 feet, holds up to 40 personnel and has a training mission for Tinker whereby personnel are being trained in the surveillance capabilities of the aircraft.



The Zonta Club of San Antonio hosted guest speaker Wiede Cutshall at their January meeting. Ms. Cutshall worked at NASA/Johnson Space Center as an engineering co-op student from UT Austin and then worked in the commercial aviation industry. Wiede started her own business in March of 2004, and has since split her time between aging aircraft supporting analysis for the U.S. Air Force, and commercial aviation modification programs. Wiede talked about the history of aviation in San Antonio. One of the most interesting stories was of the Stinson family, which included two sisters and a brother who were pioneers in flying and training pilots. Six members of the San Antonio Chapter of the 99s also attended the meeting.

The Zonta Club of Dallas hosted their annual Amelia Earhart luncheon in February supporting their Ruth Maddox Young Women in STEM award as well as local and international projects and scholarships. The club invited girls and young women and their sponsors to the luncheon which focused on providing a forum for exploring careers in the STEM fields. The luncheon speaker was AE Fellow Nicole Duncan from the University of California at Berkeley.
